Aboriginal Community-Controlled Organisation (ACCO) Fund (SA)

2023-24 grants

Round One Now Open Round one is now open to eligible South Australian Aboriginal-owned and Controlled Organisations.

Apply for grants of up to \$150,000.

Grants will build the capability and capacity of ACCOs.

Building the Aboriginal community-controlled sector is one of four key priority reforms of the National Agreement on Closing the Gap.

Applications for round one close 11.59pm on 23 May 2023.

Who can apply? All Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations (ACCO's) in SA can apply.

What is the Grant Fund?

The ACCO Grant Fund is a Closing the Gap initiative and has been developed in partnership with the SAACCON and the SA Government. Five funding rounds totaling \$2.7M are scheduled.

Funding Round One

Grants of up to \$150,000 will be awarded to eligible ACCO's for projects or initiatives that support Priority Reform Two of the National Agreement Closing the Gap, *'Building the Aboriginal Community Controlled Sector'*.

The Fund will support projects that enable ACCOs to strengthen their operations and programs or undertake new initiatives. The grant funding can support a single project or multiple activities.

Eligible projects include:

- improvements to programs, services or new initiatives
- business capability and governance projects
- projects, infrastructure/equipment upgrades or system improvements
- staff development
- in support of ACCO participation in Closing the Gap initiatives.
